# SUMMER INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

## for undergraduates

### SPEND THE SUMMER INVESTIGATING THE BRAIN

Recent advances in neuroscience are revolutionizing our ability to decipher the function of the healthy brain and the mechanisms contributing to neurological and neuropsychiatric diseases.

The Johns Hopkins Department of Neuroscience Summer Internship Program (NeuroSIP) is a 10-week program that provides research experiences for undergraduate students from diverse backgrounds, including underrepresented minority students and students from economically disadvantaged or underserved backgrounds, who are considering graduate studies in neuroscience. NeuroSIP Scholars will receive a stipend and housing at Hopkins.

NeuroSIP interns are hosted in departmental laboratories (See list of faculty members here: <https://neuroscience.jhu.edu/research/faculty>) to pursue an independent research project guided by their mentors. These research experiences are combined with a summer lunch series focused on a broad range of topics such as how to navigate careers in science and how to apply to fellowships and graduate schools. With guidance from faculty and current graduate students, this summer experience will help prepare summer interns for graduate studies and successful careers in neuroscience research.
